

# ***Instruction on Report & Presentation of Community Service Project***

## **Guidelines for students:**

### **Mission:**

1. Form a group with 6-10 members, and initiate a community service project which last at least one year (submit your group member list on the second College Counseling session of school year)
2. Develop a community service report in English (and a presentation within 5 minutes) **which addresses a social problem or concern** after the service
3. The report & presentation has to be developmental (i.e. Future plan: show how your group plans to carry on the community service of a related topic)

### **Presentation time:**

Last College Counseling Course of a school year

### **Hand in Documents :**

Report + Peer Evaluation Form are required to hand in to your College Counselor before the last College Counselling session

Please Note: If you hand in the documents after the last College Counselling session, 40% of the final marks will be deducted.

### **Evaluation Method:**

1. The report/presentation will be graded for Community Service credit per year (50% on completion + 40% on the quality of report and presentation + 10% peer evaluation )
2. Evaluation on the quality of report and presentaion:  
【Topic+Content+Creativity+Team work+Social influence】

\*Detailed scoring criteria will be included in the Scoring Rubric

### 3. Grading

Raw Score	Letter	Level	→	<u>Exemplary (E)</u>
85+	A	Satisfactory (S)	→	E should be reserved not just for good performance but for those who really do more than the minimum requirement (do something very well and unique). Less than 5% students will be considered for E.

Note: The majority should be S (A or B). Student(s) receiving level U should go to the College Counseling Office (C402) for individual case discussion within one week after the releasing of score;

\*Any student who has not recieved at least an S in all semesters completed before their H4 year:

1. the school will report their noncompliance on the transcript and mid-year report sent to schools.
2. the school will not permit their counselor/homeroom teacher to write a letter of recommendation.

# **Guidance on Community Service Report**

## **Format**

Not limited, such as posters, photos, videos, essays, research report, survey report...

## **Cover Page**

- 1) Project Title
- 2) Full name and class of project leader and member(s)

## **Content (also applicable to the presentation)**

The following contents should be covered:

1. A table showing division of work between group members
2. Summarize your group's community service project using when\where\ what\how\ why...
3. Clearly point out the social problem or concern your group found related to the chosen community service
4. Developmental Part - Future Community Service Plan:
  - What is the project about? What resources do you need?
  - How will you carry out the project? What's your plan?
  - Why do you choose this project? What is your future goal?
  - ...
5. Conclusion
